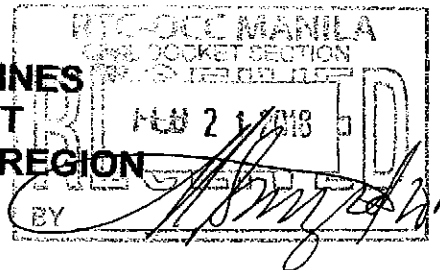

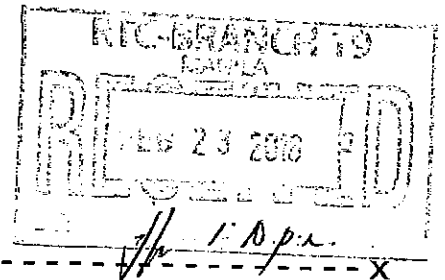

PETITION

The PETITIONER, by the undersigned State Prosecutor and to this Honorable Court, respectfully states that:

(I)

PREFATORY STATEMENT

"Men embrace communism, despite its known violence and ruthlessness, when no peaceful ways of social change seem to be left open, when the resources of patience, compromise, and reason appear exhausted. The utopian element in communism appeals particularly to those who are most in need of it, the desperate, despondent, and derelict who seek a new faith. NATURE OF THE PETITION

- (1) This Petition is filed pursuant to Section 17 of Republic Act (R.A.) No. 9372 or "The Human Security Act of 2007", seeking for an Order from this Honorable Court declaring respondents, namely, the Communist Party of the Philippines ("CPP" for brevity) and the New People's Army also known as Bagong Hukbong Bayan ("NPA" for brevity) (or collectively known as "CPP-NPA"), as terrorist and outlawed organizations, associations and/or group of persons;

**THE PARTIES**

- (2) Petitioner is an agency of the Republic of the Philippines, with power to sue and be sued, and is charged, among others, with the duty of prosecuting individuals, organizations, associations and/or group of persons violating Philippine laws;

"It is declared a policy of the State to protect life, liberty, and property from acts of terrorism, to condemn terrorism as inimical and dangerous to the national security of the country and to the welfare of the people, and to make terrorism a crime against the Filipino people, against humanity, and against the law of nations;

- (43) Section 17 of the same law, vests upon the Department of Justice the authority to apply before a competent Regional Trial Court for the issuance of an order declaring an organization, association or group of persons as terrorist and outlawed organization, association or group of persons. It provides that:

**"Section 17. *Proscription of Terrorist Organizations, Association or Group of Persons.*** - Any organization, association or group of persons organized for the purpose of engaging in terrorism, or which, although not organized for that purpose, actually uses the acts to terrorize mentioned in this Act or to sow and create a condition of widespread and extraordinary fear and panic among the populace in order to coerce the government to give in to an unlawful demand shall, upon application of the Department of Justice before a competent Regional Trial Court, with due notice and opportunity to be heard given to the organization, association or group of persons concerned, be declared as a terrorist and outlawed organization, association or group of persons by the said Regional Trial Court";

- (44) Section 17 of R.A. No. 9372 provides two (2) grounds for the issuance of an order declaring an organization, association or group of persons as terrorist and outlawed organization, association or group of persons. These are:

- (a) When an organization, association or group of persons is organized for the purpose of engaging in terrorism; or
- (b) When an organization, association or group of persons, although not organized for the

purpose of engaging in terrorism, actually uses the acts to terrorize mentioned in the said law to sow and create a condition of widespread and extraordinary fear and panic among the populace in order to coerce the government to give in to an unlawful demand;

(45) The same law defines and penalizes terrorism, as follows:

**"Section 3. Terrorism.** - Any person who commits an act punishable under any of the following provisions of the Revised Penal Code:

"(a) Article 122 (Piracy in General and Mutiny in the High Seas or in the Philippine Waters);

"(b) Article 134 (Rebellion or Insurrection);

"(c) Article 134-a (Coup d' Etat), including acts committed by private persons;

"(d) Article 248 (Murder);

"(e) Article 267 (Kidnapping and Serious Illegal Detention);

"(f) Article 324 (Crimes Involving Destruction),

"or under

"(1) Presidential Decree No. 1613 (The Law on Arson);

"(2) Republic Act No. 6969 (Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Waste Control Act of 1990);

"(3) Republic Act No. 5207, (Atomic Energy Regulatory and Liability Act of 1968);

"(4) Republic Act No. 6235 (Anti-Hijacking Law);

"(5) Presidential Decree No. 532 (Anti-Piracy and Anti-Highway Robbery Law of 1974); and

"(6) Presidential Decree No. 1866, as amended, (Decree Codifying the Laws on Illegal and Unlawful Possession, Manufacture, Dealing in, Acquisition or Disposition, of Firearms, Ammunitions or Explosives),

"thereby sowing and creating a condition of widespread and extraordinary fear and panic among the populace, in order to coerce the government to give in to an unlawful demand shall be guilty of the crime of terrorism and shall suffer the penalty of forty (40) years of imprisonment, without the benefit of parole as provided for under Act No. 4108, otherwise known as the Indeterminate Sentence Law, as amended";

(46) From the very purpose for which they were organized, i.e., to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle and, from

- (a) the bombing of Plaza Miranda;
- (b) their "Anti-Infiltration Campaigns" or purging operations;
- (c) the killing of Rejectionists Filemon "Popoy" Lagman, Romulo "Rolly" Kintanar, and Arturo "Art" Tabara; and
- (d) their extortion activities,

it is clear that respondents CPP and NPA were organized for the purpose of engaging in terrorism;

(47) The Preamble of the Constitution of the CPP even reads as follows:

"x x x In order to defeat the US Imperialists, the comprador, big bourgeoisie and the

landlords, the Party uses the weapons of protracted people's war and national united front. The party upholds the leadership of the working class, builds the basic alliance of the working class and the peasantry, and also attracts the petty urban bourgeoisie and the patriotic national bourgeoisie to the side of the national democratic revolution.

"In waging the people's war, the Party relies mainly on the mass support of the peasantry, especially the poor peasants and farm workers. The Party develops the revolutionary forces in the countryside to destroy the pillars of feudalism and the armed counterrevolution there and surround the cities from revolutionary bases until the people's democratic forces are ready to seize power in the cities" (pages 79 and 80, *Foundation for Resuming the Philippine Revolution, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*);

(48) Article IX of the Constitution of the CPP also reads that:

**"Section 3.** The New People's Army shall be the main weapon of the Party in the people's democratic revolution and in the subsequent socialist stage. It fully welds the basic alliance of the working class and the peasantry. In the countryside, it shall create an independent regime through armed struggle, agrarian revolution and rural bases" (page 92, *Foundation for Resuming the Philippine Revolution, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*);

(49) The Preamble of the Basic Rules of the NPA reads as follows:

"x x x The main strategic principle of the New People's Army is a protracted people's war in which its armed units continuously gather strength from the countryside based on people's war, agrarian revolution and building its bases. This includes the strategy of encircling the cities from the countryside,

defeating the enemy by portions until its strength wears out.

X X X

"The New People's Army will pass through three strategic stages in waging the protracted people's war. The first stage is the strategic defensive, wherein it maintains the initiative in tactical offensives against the strategic military advantage of the enemy. The second stage is the strategic stalemate, wherein its fighting capacity is more or less equal to that of the enemy. The third and the last stage is the strategic offensive wherein the forces of the New People's Army have developed their strength capable of assaulting the enemy forces in their very own fortifications within the cities and in big camps" (pages 120 and 121, *Foundation for Resuming the Philippine Revolution*, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]);

- (50) Moreover, from the twelve (12) incidents enumerated in paragraph 35 hereof, it is clear that the CPP-NPA continue to commit acts of terror, by committing the predicate offenses of murder, kidnapping and arson, to sow and create a condition of widespread and extraordinary fear and panic among the populace in order to coerce the Philippine Government to give in to its unlawful demand, i.e., for the CPP-NPA to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and seize control of the Philippine Government;
- (51) In fact, by reason of their terrorist activities, the CPP-NPA was designated as a terrorist group or organization by the USA and by the EU;
- (52) On August 2, 2002, the CPP-NPA was designated by the US Department of State as a Foreign Terrorist Organization, per Public Notice 4094.

A copy of the said designation published in Federal Register, Vol. 67, No. 154, August 9, 2002, is attached as Annex VVVV and made part hereof;



- (53) As of October 3, 2016, the designation of respondent CPP-NPA as a Foreign Terrorist Organization was maintained by the US Department of State, as per Public Notice No. 9768.

A copy of the said designation published in Federal Register, Vol. 81, No. 203, October 20, 2016, is attached as Annex WWWW and made part hereof;

- (54) On June 15, 2009, the EU, in Council Common Position 2009/468/CFSP, included Jose Maria Sison and the CPP-NPA in its list of terrorist persons, groups and entities.

A copy of Council Common Position 2009/468/CFSP, inclusive of its annexes, is attached as Annex XXXXX and made part hereof;

- (55) On August 4, 2017, the EU, in Council Decision (CFSP) 2017/1426, still included the CPP-NPA in its list of terrorist groups and entities.

A copy of Council Decision (CFSP) 2017/1426, inclusive of its annexes, is attached as Annex YYYYY and made part hereof;

- (56) However, despite

- (a) Its/their designation as terrorist organization or group by the USA and by the EU, and
- (b) the Philippine Government's and President Duterte's good faith, willingness and sincerity to negotiate with them for a genuine and lasting peace,

the CPP-NPA adamantly, deceptively, treacherously, mercilessly and ruthlessly continue with its/their terrorist activities to the detriment of the national security of the country and the welfare of the Filipino people;

- (57) In fact, after the issuance of Proclamations No. 360 and 374, the CPP-NPA's intent to continue with its terrorist acts or arms struggle in order to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government, is evident from the following pronouncements:

**"Unite the Filipino people to resist and overthrow the fascist US-Duterte regime x x x**  
The Filipino people are suffering gravely under the Duterte regime's fascist tyranny, all-out economic liberalization and bureaucratic corruption. The entire Party and all revolutionary forces must exert vigorous effort to unite the Filipino people in a broad united front to resist and overthrow the fascist Duterte regime as they did the Marcos dictatorship and the Estrada regime" (*Ang Bayan, Pahayagan ng Partido Komunista ng Pilipinas, Pinapatnubayan ng Marxismo-Leninismo-Maoismo, Special Issue, December 26, 2017*);

**"Isolate completely and overthrow the oppressive US-Duterte regime x x x** In this light, the revolutionary forces should lead in launching campaigns, both armed and unarmed, to deal strong blows to weaken and eventually overthrow the regime. Mass movements defending the livelihood and welfare of the people should be strengthened alongside the resistance against the regime's fascist measures and triple wars of suppression. The regime's disregard for the people's welfare while defending the imperialist interests and those of the ruling classes should be thoroughly exposed and opposed.

"Duterte's overthrow is the most important task at present for the revolutionary forces. It is crucial to the rapid strengthening and growth of the revolutionary forces in order to defend the people against the regime's relentless attacks. The revolutionary forces should take advantage of the cracks among the ruling classes. They should ally with other sectors and groups to create the widest anti-Duterte alliance, including groups with existing sharp contradictions with the revolutionary movement. While these contradictions will not be swept aside, it is imperative that the sharpest blows should be aimed at the semifeudal and semicolonial system's representative, the US-Duterte regime" (*Ang Bayan, Pahayagan ng Partido Komunista ng Pilipinas, Pinapatnubayan ng Marxismo-*

Copies of Ang Bayan December 26, 2017 Special Issue and January 7, 2018 English Edition, are attached as Annex **ZZZZZ** and **AAAAAA**, respectively, and made parts hereof;

- (58) Jose Maria Sison was even emphatic in declaring that the NPA can kill one (1) soldier each day per region in order to compel the GRP to resume the peace negotiations:

"What the NPA can do in order to compel or persuade the GRP to resume the peace negotiations is to carry out successfully the announced plan of the CPP to intensify tactical offensives against armed units of the AFP, PNP and auxillary forces and to punish notorious human rights violators, local tyrants, land grabbers, drug lords and other notorious criminals. With or without Duterte as president, the GRP will decide to negotiate peace when the people's war can inflict larger casualties on enemy troops.

"The NPA in 17 regions has actually the capacity of knocking out at least one AFP soldier every day per region. That eliminates at least 510 enemy troops or some 5 companies every month nationwide. That translates to the eliminaton of some 60 companies or 20 basic battalions every year. The NPA has the advantage of having a just cause and enjoying the support of the people and being able to launch ambushes and raids by surprise. In sharp contrast, the reactionary troops are hated by the people, are exposed to public view and are practically deaf and blind in operations against the NPA most of the time (*On the Question of JASIG and what the NPA can do to compel the GRP to Resume Peace Negotiations, February 4, 2018, by Prof. Jose Maria Sison, NDFP Chief Political Consultant*).

A copy of the above article is marked as Annex **BBBBBB** and made part hereof.

(59) The foregoing declarations prove that the CPP-NPA never intended to sincerely enter into peace negotiations with the Philippine Government, but they did so only to deceive the latter to release their officers and members from prison in the guise of attending peace talks;

(60) This strategy of deception, where the CPP-NPA succeeded after the Marcos regime, is not about achieving a lasting peace or any peace at all, but is part of the "protracted people's war", described as:

"Our strategic line in our people's war is to encircle the cities from the countryside until such **time** that we become capable of moving on the cities from stable revolutionary bases in the countryside. For a **long time**, we have to develop guerilla warfare on a nationwide scale so as to convert into our advantage the disadvantage of fighting in a small archipelagic country, whose countryside is so vast in relation to the cities but fragmented into so many islands" (*page 355, Building Strength through Struggle, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*);

(61) Indeed, deception is the key to the CPP-NPA's "strategy of protracted war", vividly explained as follows:

"Insurgent guerrilla forces always start from scratch. At the initial stage of insurgency, the rebel army is small and weak, while the forces of the government they seek to overthrow are big and strong. For the insurgents, the key factor at this stage is **TIME**. They need **time** to expand and strengthen their armed forces. They need **time** for party building. They need **time** for establishing, expanding and consolidating base areas in as many parts of the country as possible. They need **time** for organizing a broad and united front to totally isolate the ruling regime. They need **time** for politicizing and mobilizing the people for mass support for what they call *people's war*. All these vital and necessary ingredients for a successful insurgency require **time** to

develop; hence, the strategy of protracted war" (page 25, *Silent War*, 1989, by Victor N. Corpus);

- (62) From the foregoing, respondents CPP and NPA are merely buying **TIME** by deceiving the Philippine Government in entering into peace talks, while their main purpose is to mobilize all their forces in preparation for the "people's war" aimed at overthrowing the duly constituted authorities, seizing control of the Philippine Government and imposing a totalitarian regime;
- (63) Thus, there is no other time to put an end to their deception, to their "protracted people's war" and to their evil plan of imposing a totalitarian regime, but through the filing of this Petition and, consequently, by declaring respondents CPP and NPA as terrorist and outlawed organizations, associations and/or group of persons;
- (64) Finally, to quote Nathan Gilbert Quimpo:

"After the 1986 People Power uprising, I wrote several critical articles arguing that the revolutionary left could have come to power – or at least have shared power - if the Party had made certain shifts in strategy or tactics. After the CPP split, I told friends, 'Thank goodness, we didn't win in 1986. If we had, the Philippines would have ended up with a regime worse than Marcos's - a totalitarian dictatorship'" (page 459, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years*, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo).

  - (c) Congress of the Re-Establishment; or
  - (d) The First Great Rectification Movement.

This Congress was attended by the following founders of the re-established CPP:

- (a) Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero;
- (b) Arthur Garcia a.k.a. Estrella Del Sur;
- (c) Nilo Tayag;
- (d) Fernando Tayag;
- (e) Leoncio Co;
- (f) Monico Atienza;
- (g) Herminigildo Garcia IV;
- (h) Manuel Collantes;
- (i) Renato Casipe;
- (j) Ibarra Tubianosa;
- (k) Renato Pangilinan; and
- (l) Ruben Guevarra a.k.a. Lilia Tambunting.

Also present and serving as security during the said Congress were:

- (a) Mariano Laxa; and
- (b) Manuel Alavado.

- (10) Respondent CPP's aim is to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle. It has been fighting a guerrilla war against the Philippine Government since its formation. It has direct leadership over respondent NPA, its armed wing (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on January 18, 2003, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista*);
- (11) On respondent CPP's aim to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle, Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero said:

"The Communist Party of the Philippines is determined to lead the Philippine revolution from victory to victory. It is exerting all efforts to arouse and mobilize the Filipino people, achieve the people's democratic revolution against US imperialism and its local running dogs and fulfill its share in the liberation of mankind from the scourge of imperialism.

"Long live the Communist Party of the Philippines!

"Long live Marxism-Leninism-Mao Zedong Thought!

Also present and serving as security during the said Congress were:

- (a) Mariano Laxa; and
- (b) Manuel Alavado.

Although the "Congress of the Re-Establishment" was held in January 1968, at Barrio Makuhol, Mangatarem, Pangasinan, the date placed in the official documents of the CPP is December 26, 1968, to coincide with the 75<sup>th</sup> birthday of Mao Tse Tung or Mao Zedong, the communist leader of the People's Republic of China (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on January 18, 2003, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista*).

A copy of the *Sinumpaang Salaysay* executed, on January 18, 2003, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista is attached as Annex D and made part hereof;

- (10) Respondent CPP's aim is to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle. It has been fighting a guerrilla war against the Philippine Government since its formation. It has direct leadership over respondent NPA, its armed wing (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on January 18, 2003, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista*);
- (11) On respondent CPP's aim to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and to seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle, Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero said:

"The Communist Party of the Philippines is determined to lead the Philippine revolution from victory to victory. It is exerting all efforts to arouse and mobilize the Filipino people, achieve the people's democratic revolution against US imperialism and its local running dogs and fulfill its share in the liberation of mankind from the scourge of imperialism.

"Long live the Communist Party of the Philippines!

"Long live Marxism-Leninism-Mao Zedong Thought!



"Unite to overthrow the US-Marcos dictatorship!

"Fight for national freedom and democracy!

"Expand and intensify the revolutionary armed struggle!

"Be resolute, fear no sacrifice and surmount every difficulty to win victory!

"Down with US imperialism, feudalism and bureaucrat capitalism!

"Long live the Philippine revolution!

"Long live the Filipino people!" (page 87, *Building Strength through Struggle*, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]);

- (12) Respondent NPA is the armed wing of respondent CPP. It was formally established, on March 29, 1969, by the following members of the Central Committee of respondent CPP and by the following members from the "Hukbong Mapagpalaya ng Bayan" group of Bernabe Buscayno alias Commander Dante:

- (a) Jose Maria Sison;
- (b) Arthur Garcia;
- (c) Nilo Tayag;
- (d) Fernando Tayag;
- (e) Leoncio Co;
- (f) Monico Atienza;
- (g) Herminigildo Garcia IV;
- (h) Manuel Collantes;
- (i) Renato Casipe;
- (j) Ibarra Tubianosa;
- (k) Renato Pangilinan;
- (l) Ruben Guevarra;
- (m) Bernabe Buscayno @ Kumander Dante;
- (n) Jose Buscayno @ Kumander Joe;
- (o) Juanito Rivera @ Kumander Juaning;
- (p) Eduardo Layug @ Kumander Eddie;
- (q) Segundo Miranda @ Kumander Goody;
- (r) Ernesto Miranda @ Kumander Panchito;
- (s) Roberto Santos @ Kumander Felman;
- (t) Ka Antong; and
- (u) Ka Oscar.

Since then, the CPP-NPA, through its "Sandatahang Yunit Pampropaganda" or "SYP", has fought its version of the "protracted people's war" against the Philippine

Government (*Sinumpaang Salaysay* executed, on January 18, 2003, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista);

- (13) On respondent NPA being the armed wing of respondent CPP, Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero said:

"The New People's Army celebrates today with boundless joy its fourth anniversary since its establishment by the Communist Party of the Philippines under the powerful illumination of Marxism-Leninism-Mao Zedong Thought. Through the last four years, this army under the absolute leadership of the Party has valiantly and victoriously fought for the national and democratic interests of the Filipino people against US imperialism, feudalism and bureaucratic capitalism. It has brilliantly proven itself to be the authentic, enduring and mighty sword of the people in a protracted people's war against foreign and feudal domination" (*page 109 Building Strength through Struggle, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*).

"We must further strengthen the New People's Army as the main form of organization under the leadership of the Party and carry forward the revolutionary armed struggle as the main form of our people's struggle. We have established a good basis for the further strengthening of the New People's Army.

"Our Red fighters have a high level of political consciousness and are closely linked with the masses. Every squad has a party group within it and oftentimes the majority of the Red fighters are Party members. The Party branch is based currently on the platoon" (*page 353 Building Strength through Struggle, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*);

- (14) Also, on respondent NPA being the armed wing of respondent CPP, Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero further said that:

### **"The Main Tasks of the New People's Army**

"Under the Marxist-Leninist principle that the Party commands the gun, the New People's Army follows the absolute leadership of the Communist Party of the Philippines and the supreme command of Mao Zedong Thought.

"The New People's Army is an instrument for implementing the Party Program for a People's Democratic Revolution. It is, as a matter of fact, the principal organization under the command of the Communist Party of the Philippines, an organization for waging the main form of struggle, armed struggle, in the people's democratic revolution" (page 113, *Foundation for Resuming the Philippine Revolution, 2013, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]*);

- (15) Advocated by no less than Jose Maria Sison a.k.a. Amado Guerrero, he described the "protracted people's war", as follows:

"Chairman Mao's theory of people's war is summed up from twenty-two continuous years of people's war in a vast country like China. x x x The protraction in time and the vastness in scale of this people's war, contending with the most powerful imperialist and puppet armies and encompassing the widest yet the most particular circumstances, are unprecedented in the entire history of mankind and of the international communist movement. x x x Most of those waging armed struggle in the world's countryside are applying Chairman Mao's strategic line of encircling the cities from the countryside. x x x The weakest links of imperialist power are found in the countryside of the world just as they are also to be found in the countryside of a semicolonial and semifeudal country. This countryside provides the people with a vastly greater area for maneuver, which cannot be effectively occupied by the enemy forces, as thoroughly as these can the cities, especially in the stage of his strategic offensive. Until the situation is ripe for their seizure, the cities are the well-secured centers of the political and economic

power of the enemy" (pages 124 and 125, *Defeating Revisionism, Reformism & Opportunism, 2013*, by Jose Ma. Sison [Amado Guerrero]);

- (16) Unknown to many, the August 21, 1971 Plaza Miranda bombing in Quiapo, Manila, was a terrorist act committed, not by the Marcos regime, but by the CPP-NPA (page 454, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years, 2012*, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo), which reverberated what Jose Maria Sison once said, that:

"hindi tayo ordinaryong criminal na maaring bayaran para pumatay at hindi tayo maaring magpagamit para sa makasariling interes ng sinumang pulitiko . . . Ang pinakamataas nating hinahangad ay ma patindi ang panloob na labanan sa hanay ng mga naghaharing uri hanggang sa punto na sila-sila ang magpatayan. Magsasagawa tayo ng karahasan hindi dahil gusto nating may kabayaran kundi dahil gusto nating umiral ang kondisyon na hinahangad nating umiral" (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on January 18, 2003*, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista);

- (17) Apart from proving to the Chinese Communist Party or Partido Kumunista ng Tsina (CCP-PKT) that the Philippines is experiencing a "revolutionary situation" in exchange for CCP-PKT's financial assistance and arms donation, the goal of Jose Maria Sison and the CPP-NPA in bombing Plaza Miranda was to ensure the "Great Leap Forward" or "Revolutionary Leap" of the CPP-NPA's armed struggle or what Jose Maria Sison claims to be the "dialectical materialism" or "historical materialism" (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on January 18, 2003*, by Ruben Guevarra y Bautista; interview of Victor Corpus by Secretary Martin Andanar, in *Martin's Mancave Lifecast; Silent War, 1989*, by Victor N. Corpus);

- (18) Indeed, after the Plaza Miranda bombing, the CCP-PKT made good its promise of arms donation to the CPP-NPA. Thus, on July 4, 1972, about 1,400 rifles were shipped to Digoyo Point, Palanan, Isabela, Philippines, on board MV Karagatan (formerly Kishi Maru). MV Karagatan was met

by the group of then CPP-NPA commander (later Chief, Intelligence Service, Armed Forces of the Philippines, and Retired Brigadier General) Victor N. Corpus, who encountered resistance from the group of then Philippine Constabulary Intelligence Officer (later Philippine National Police Director General) Edgardo Aglipay (*I-Witness: "Ang Pagbabalik sa Karagatan" dokumentaryo ni Howie Severino; pages 176 and 310, Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo*);

- (19) Moving forward, the 1980s marked the "Regression Stage" of the CPP-NPA. Believing that their ranks were infiltrated by deep penetration agents from the Armed Forces of the Philippines, the CPP-NPA launched another set of terrorist acts through its "Anti-Infiltration Campaigns" against suspected deep penetration agents, including innocent civilians (*pages 418, 419, 443 and 444, Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo; Supplemental Affidavit executed, on October 9, 2006, by Veronica P. Tabara*).

A copy of the Supplemental Affidavit executed, on October 9, 2006, by Veronica P. Tabara, is attached as Annex E and made part hereof;

- (20) The "Anti-Infiltration Campaigns" resulted to purging operations which were not based on clear, solid and adequate evidence, but were triggered by unfounded fears, suspicions, paranoia and dementia. These operations victimized a large number of CPP-NPA cadres and members, including innocent civilians (*pages 113 to 124, To Suffer Thy Comrades: How the Revolution Decimated its Own, 2001, by Robert Francis Garcia*);
- (21) Further, "The most glaring human error committed during the anti-infiltration campaigns was the use of torture. Used to forcibly draw out information, it merely succeeded in generating false testimonies. This in turn created the vicious cycle that soon threatened to consume the very people who instigated the campaigns in the first place". Quoting Paco Arguelles, "He said that the movement as a whole can never 'continue addressing the human rights questions of our times with moral integrity without coming to terms fully' with this 'biggest human rights tragedy for

the Philippine revolutionary or national democratic movement" (pages 114 and 116, *To Suffer Thy Comrades: How the Revolution Decimated its Own*, 2001, by Robert Francis Garcia);

- (22) "Hundreds, possibly even thousands, of innocent cadres and activists were brought to makeshift prison camps, tortured and summarily killed by their own comrades" (page 419, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years*, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo). "What started as an effort to investigate a limited number of *kasama* suspected of being undercover agents of the Philippine military became a full-blown nightmare for everyone in the movement. Torture was used in the investigation of suspects who, innocent or otherwise, pointed to other comrades to relieve the extreme pain. A chain reaction followed, and with it, panic enveloped entire organizations. The collective paranoia resulted in other abuses, and eventually, mass killings" (pages 443 and 444, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years*, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo);

- (23) In expressing his regret for being himself a victim of a purging operation, Robert Francis Garcia laments that:

"A given fact about revolution is that joining it entails sacrifice. A deep sense of regret, thus, is engendered when the very thing for which one's sacrifices were meant becomes the very thing that persecutes him. As I wrote in a previous article:

"When we decided to join the movement, we had accepted the probability of either being killed in battle, being arrested and tortured by the enemy, or losing our beloved friends. But nothing prepared us for OPML (*Operation Missing Link*). You may not regret joining the movement while your balls are being electrocuted by a military officer - your commitment may even be fired up all the more. But it's infinitely more painful when people you had placed in high regard are pointing M-16s at your head and screaming, 'Run!'" (page 69, *To Suffer Thy Comrades*:

- (24) The "Anti-Infiltration Campaigns", apart from resulting in heavy losses to the CPP-NPA, was among the root causes of "The Second Great Rectification Movement" in January 1992, which reviewed and rectified the errors that created havoc in the revolutionary movement;
- (25) The "Second Great Rectification Movement", in turn, caused a split in the CPP-NPA between the "Reaffirmists" and the "Rejectionists" (*Affidavit of Complaint executed, on January 20, 2006, by Veronica P. Tabara*). Thus,

"In December 1992, Joma sent faxes to the *Philippine Daily Inquirer* naming Central Committee members Ric Reyes, Rolly Kintanar, and Benjamin de Vera as 'renegades and counter-revolutionaries.' By publicly branding the three as enemies, Joma effectively short-circuited organizational rules and procedures. It meant that there would no longer be debate and discussion inside the Party, no Party congress, and no due process for those accused.

"The effect on the CPP of the '10<sup>th</sup> plenum' and Sison's faxes was a full-blown split. Large chunks of the Party and the NPA openly declared their opposition to, and autonomy from, what they called Armando Liwanag's (Joma's) Central Committee. The first was the Manila-Rizal region in July 1985 with about 5,000 members. This was followed by two more regions and the National Peasant Secretariat. Then the Central Mindanao Region followed. Finally, most of the island regional organizations in Visayas, except Samar-Leyte, bolted.

"By the end of 1993, two conflicting forces had emerged: the 'reaffirmists', who remained loyal to Joma, and were eventually called the 'RAs', and the 'rejectionists' or 'RJs' who rejected Joma's unwavering position" (page 447, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of*

*the Marcos Years, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo);*

(26) The split in the CPP-NPA further led to the killing, among others, of the following "Rejectionists":

- (b) Romulo "Rolly" Kintanar, inside Kamameshi Restaurant, Quezon Memorial Circle, Quezon City, on January 23, 2003; and
- (c) Arturo "Art" Tabara, at the parking lot of SM Fairview, Quezon City, on September 26, 2004 (*Affidavit of Complaint executed, January 20, 2006, by Veronica P. Tabara; Supplemental Joint Affidavit executed, on May 23, 2006, by Gloria Asuncion Jopson-Kintanar and Veronica P. Tabara; Sinumpaang Salaysay executed, on May 19, 2006, by Rafael Cruz y Glemao*).

- (c) Kampanyang Ahos or Kahos, in Mindanao, 1985 to 1986;
- (d) Operation Missing Link, in Southern Tagalog, 1987 and 1988; and



- (e) Olympia, overseeing the "Anti-Infiltration Campaign" covering Central Luzon, Cordillera, Leyte, Cebu and the National Capital Region (*To Suffer Thy Comrades: How the Revolution Decimated its Own*, 2001, by Robert Francis Garcia; page 443, *Subversive Lives - A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years*, 2012, by Susan F. Quimpo and Nathan Gilbert Quimpo);
- (28) The "Operation VD", committed sometime in May and June 1985, resulted to the death of innocent and helpless civilians, whose remains were unearthed, on August 25, 2006, after the discovery of a mass grave at Sitio Sapang Dako, Barangay Kaulisihan, Inopacan, Leyte (*Sinumpaang Salaysay executed by Glicerio Roluna y Senones; Gisumpaan nga Gipanulti executed, on September 14, 2006, by Zacarias Piedad y Tudas; Gisumpaan nga Gipanulti executed by Numeriano Beringuel y Batas; Sinumpaang-Asoy executed, on September 14, 2006, by Floro M. Tanaid; Supplemental Affidavit executed, on October 9, 2006, by Veronica P. Tabara*).

- (29) Witnesses accounts about the disappearance of innocent and helpless civilians, and about the mass grave at Sitio Sapang Dako, Barangay Kaulisihan, Inopacan, Leyte, led to the filing of Criminal Case No. 08-262163 (formerly Criminal Case No. 1581) and Criminal Cases No. 14306533 to 14306546, for fifteen (15) counts of Murder, pending before the Regional Trial Court, National Capital Judicial Region, Branch 32, Manila;
- (30) Among the accused in Criminal Case No. 08-262163 and Criminal Cases No. 14306533 to 14306546, are the following officers and members of the CPP-NPA:

The Philippine Government, driven by its sincerity and desire to achieve a lasting peace, acceded. However, the CPP-NPA continued with their tactical offensives against Philippine Government forces and atrocities against civilians;
- (32) Among the atrocities of the CPP-NPA against civilians are their extortion activities or collection of revolutionary taxes from the following companies or persons, or destruction of property for refusal to pay said taxes, to name a few:
  - (a) Patagan Marble Company, owned by Willy Patagan;
  - (b) Frenie Silverio, Quarry Operator;
  - (c) Campos Quarrying Company;
  - (d) Palad Quarrying Company, owned by Cynthia Palad;
  - (e) Lowel Trucking, owned by Lowel Esquibel;
  - (f) Saplala Grocery;
  - (g) Triple-J Grocery;
  - (h) Dante Palad;
  - (i) Valenciano Cruz;
  - (j) Killing of cows owned by a certain Atay during the first (1<sup>st</sup>) quarter of 1997, in Barangay Malibay, San Miguel, Bulacan;
  - (k) Burning of the PLDT tower during the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) quarter of 1996, in Barangay Camatcin, Doña Remedios Trinidad, Bulacan; and
  - (l) Burning of the Globe Telecom tower during the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) quarter of 1996, in Barangay Alagaw, San Idelfonso, Bulacan (*Sinumpaang*

*Salaysay executed on May 19, 2006, by Rafael Cruz y Glemao);*

- (33) On July 1, 2016, when Rodrigo Roa Duterte became the President of the Republic of the Philippines, he made good his promise to resume peace talks with the CPP-NPA, as peace talks resumed in Oslo, Norway;
- (34) Once again, the CPP-NPA sought the temporary release of some, if not all, of the accused in Criminal Case No. 08-262163 and Criminal Cases No. 14306533 to 14306546, and those in other criminal cases. The Duterte Administration, driven by its sincerity and desire to achieve a lasting peace, acceded, as evidenced by the attached copy of the Memorandum of Secretary of Justice Vitaliano N. Aguirre II addressed to all concerned Chiefs of Regional, Provincial and City Prosecution Offices and Handling Prosecutors dated August 9, 2016, marked as Annex CC and made part hereof;
- (35) However, despite the Philippine Government's and President Duterte's sincere efforts to negotiate with the CPP-NPA for a genuine and lasting peace, the latter treacherously and ruthlessly pursued their tactical offensives against Philippine Government forces, including civilians, by committing the following terrorist acts, to name a few:
  - (a) The March 8, 2017 ambush of PNP personnel, at Barangay Sibayan, Bansalan, Davao Del Sur, resulting to the death of four (4), and injury to one (1), PNP personnel and, destruction and taking away of Government property. This incident resulted to the filing of informations in Court for Attempted Murder, four (4) counts of Murder, Robbery and Malicious Mischief.

- (40) Respondents CPP and NPA were organized for the purpose of engaging in terrorism and, for almost half a century have been, and are still, using acts of terror to sow and create a condition of widespread and extraordinary fear and panic among the populace in order to overthrow the duly constituted authorities and seize control of the Philippine Government through armed struggle;
- (41) The CPP-NPA has been designated by the United States of America ("*USA*" for brevity) and by the European Union ("*EU*" for brevity), as terrorist organization, group and/or entity;
